Call to Order: Crissy Belknap, Policy Council Co-Chair called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM.

Items For Approval:

Approval of November Meeting Minutes: A motion was made by Terrah Ingram and seconded by Harley Leake. There were no questions or opposition. Motion passed.

Approval of New Employees: New employees were presented by each Area Supervisor as follows: **Position-** *Teacher* Tiffany Allen and Jacqueline Briggs-Howard for South Joplin HS, Rebecca Bowlin for Anderson

Position- *Teacher Aide* Alison Hawes for Carthage EHS, Julie Rector for Carthage HS, Mariah Stiger for North Joplin HS, Hana Hendry for North Joplin EHS

Position- Area Maintenance Alain Roy for Anderson

Motion to approve all new hires was made by Michelle Burge and seconded by Andrew Nulsen. There were no objections. The motion passed.

Items for Review:

Update from the Assistant Director: Kathy Miller shared Budget, In Kind and CACFP Report. She shared that In Kind for Head Start is lower than we would expect this time of year. Kathy also shared the Credit Card report information and Recent Correspondence from the Office of Head Start.

Board Report:Rito Soto, Board Liaison stated that he was unable to attend the previous board meeting. Leisa Harnar reviewed the Board Meeting report and the items that were discussed at the last board meeting.

Update on Head Start Enrollment, Waitlists, and Attendance Numbers: Amy Schmidt, Enrollment Coordinator shared Enrollment reports. Head Start is still currently not fully enrolled but Early Head Start remains fully enrolled. Waitlist information was reviewed also and discussion of ongoing recruitment events. Amy Shared the plan to be fully enrolled by the beginning of January and that we would be enrolling some over income in order to meet that goal. Reasons for Absences were discussed and plans to update attendance success plans were also shared.

School Readiness Reports:

Head Start: Cindy Ladbasri and Kim Goddard shared data on the School Readiness Goals from Head Start. They emphasized the importance of Social/ Emotional development and learning. Cindy shared that

in the Southern areas 85% of children are on track with Social/Emotional goals. Kim shared that more than ½ of the Northern classrooms have met 90% of the goals. Kim and Cindy shared that new Teachers have the most need for assistance with classroom management and both have been making additional visits based on those needs.

Early Head Start Classrooms: Jenae Polok shared the school readiness data for Early Head Start classrooms. She shared that the goals for early head start is 90% in all domains. She shared there has been a downward trend in the areas of language and math for children in classrooms and at our childcare partners. She also shared information on the new classroom assessment that is conducted-ITERS. It has been completed once, in September 2021 and one will be completed at the end of the year to review progress.

Early Head Start Home Based: Stephanie Massey shared data for the Home based program option. She shared that Home Visitors set Child Development goals with families on the first visit. She pointed out that the HV asks the parents what they want their child to learn. She shared that the program does screenings and regular assessment in the home. The data showed that in most age groups they had met the goal of 90% in all domains, however, with the older toddlers, there has been a downward trend in the areas of Cognitive development. She shared how the program is working to enhance the home environment by providing parents with quality materials.

Approval of New Policy:

Head Start/Early Head Start Masking Policy: Leisa Harnar began by sharing the Interim Final Rule (IFC) from the Office of Head Start regarding vaccines and masking. She shared that this ruling is not final at this time and that if they want to make any comments they have until December 30, 2021. A link to the Federal Register was shared in the comments. Leisa also informed the Policy Council that this is a requirement that the program must follow or we could be found deficient during a review. Kandi Griffith presented the Program's new policy which outlines how we will follow the mandate. It was emphasized that no child would be forced to wear a mask, that we would use positive encouragement to help children with masking, no child would be shamed or treated differently with or without a mask and finally, no child would be dropped if they don't wear the mask. The floor was open for discussion. Many parents expressed their sadness, frustration, and concern over the masking and mandating parents to be vaccinated in order to volunteer. Leisa shared that she and Kathy Miller would be meeting with Representatives from Binax who is offering free Covid test kits to Head Start so that families and staff would not have to provide their own testing. Discussions continued. Lesia shared that the Policy Council has a right to say no to the policy-and encouraged a Roll call vote.

The vote went as follows: Crissy Belknap- No, Andrew Nulsen- No, Brittany Combs-Yes, Terra Ingram-No, Harley Leake- No, Rito Soto- No, Migdalia Torres- yes, Michelle Burge- No, Veronica Lee- Yes Maria Salas- No. 7 no/3 yes. The Policy did not pass. Leisa shared that the requirements are part of the Head Start Performance Standards and that procedures complying with the mandate will have to be implemented, but that she would share the concerns of the parents with the Regional Office. Leisa encouraged the parents again to post their comments regarding their concerns to the Public Comment link before 12/30/21.

Head Start Director's Report: Leisa Harnar

- 1. Open Positions: 15 current positions open in Head Start
- 2. The Vaccine Mandate has been discussed with Staff- Many will file an exemption and some will be getting the vaccine.
- 3. We have been notified that the Local Health Departments no longer have the authority to require quarantine and isolation of those with Covid or exposed to Covid. This should decrease the number of classroom closures.

- 4. Enrollment is very close. We have a plan to be fully enrolled by 1/31/22. The staff have worked so harde and we are very proud of them.
- 5. We have a virtual Meeting tomorrow regarding Covid Testing.
- 6. New Partnership with Leffen Center for Autism.
- 7. Staff Wellness program- emphasis on Mental Health at this time.






BUDGETS AT A GLANCE FEDERAL, STATE, & CCP



Dear Head Start programs,

In May 2021, the Office of Head Start (OHS) released ACF-PI-HS-21-04 OHS Expectations for Head Start Programs in Program Year (PY) 2021-2022. Since that time, your programs have been working tirelessly to meet these expectations, including working toward full enrollment and providing in-person comprehensive services for all enrolled children regardless of program option. Head Start programs have shown strength and resilience in many ways. You have provided meals to children, connected families to health care, and helped lead the way to vaccine access in your communities. The leadership, passion, and commitment of our Head Start staff have kept programs moving forward since the beginning and in every stage of the COVID-19 pandemic.

OHS has been watching the surge in COVID-19 cases, both locally and nationally. In response to recent developments, OHS will not resume the evaluation of which programs will enter into the Full Enrollment Initiative beginning in January 2022. OHS will continue to track enrollment in the Head Start Enterprise System (HSES), as we have done since September 2021, and to expect full in-person comprehensive service contingent upon U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines, state and local health department guidance, and in consideration of local school districts' decisions.

We know our Head Start programs and staff will continue to innovate, lead, and make decisions based on the unique needs of their families and workforce. OHS will continue to support programs in developing policies and procedures and in using American Rescue Plan funds to meet the needs of their community in this challenging time.

Thank you for your continued dedication to OHS, and happy holidays.

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

Dear Head Start community,

Thank you for your commitment to providing comprehensive services for children and families and connecting them to safe, nurturing environments during this ongoing pandemic. As we begin the new year, there is an understandable concern about the impacts of the COVID-19 variants. This is an especially challenging time as Head Start programs move forward in serving more children while also grappling with the dynamics of this ever-changing pandemic. The Office of Head Start (OHS) is committed to supporting programs with this balance. In keeping with this commitment, OHS will continue to pause the evaluation of which programs will enter the Full Enrollment Initiative.

While we were hopeful the pandemic would be ending by now, OHS recognizes that the public health emergency continues throughout the country. We also know that Head Start children and families depend on in-person services. During this time, programs should continue making decisions about service delivery that are informed by U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and local health department guidelines and based on what is best for families. Programs are encouraged to use existing plans to adapt to changes in community conditions and partner with their regional office throughout the process.

OHS encourages programs to use their American Rescue Plan funds to support staff and families in getting vaccinated, purchase COVID-19 at-home tests, and ensure a supply of personal protective equipment (PPE) for everyone. Head Start programs have the flexibility to determine which one-time investments best support the needs of staff, children, and families while adhering to federal, state, and local guidance.

We all must do our part to reduce the spread of COVID-19. Therefore, it is highly recommended that all eligible individuals be vaccinated against COVID-19 and wear a mask indoors. Information about the vaccine, such as where to get one, can be found at www.vaccines.gov. Programs can also lower the risk of exposure to the virus with a layered prevention strategy that includes test-to-stay, keeping distance, screening testing, ventilation, hand-washing, and staying home when sick.

With so many suffering with grief and enormous stress, it is more important than ever to focus on the essential components of Head Start services: health, safety, and good nutrition along with an emphasis on relationships that are respectful, responsive, inclusive, and supportive. Since 1965, Head Start programs have provided critical resources, services, and support to thousands of children and families in times of crisis. This is all taking place as staff care for their own families and personal well-being.

Uniting as a Head Start community to co-create a new and innovative path forward has been a huge part of successfully navigating this pandemic. Thank you for being committed to moving **Head Start Forward** together!












- 1. Head Start is still not fully enrolled, however, we have several children accepted and anticipate full enrollment by the end of the month.

Enrollment by Income Status











- 1. We are serving families from a variety of Income Statuses.










- 1. Three sites have good waitlists while six sites are struggling.
