The Comprehensive Homeless Assistance for New Career Employment (CHANCE) was the first program in Southwest Missouri dedicated to helping homeless people gain employment as means to transition off the streets and away from public assistance.

ESC's CHANCE integrative program is a solution that reduces poverty in our community through cultivating an educated and skilled workforce which creates selfsupporting individuals and families.

Accomplishments

CHANCE equipped 36 job-ready participants this past year.

CHANCE experienced an 17% increase in the number of individuals who gained employment from last year.

CHANCE's average starting wage for fulltime and part-time positions combined was \$10.55. The average starting wage for fulltime employment was \$11.36

CHANCE permanently housed 42% of the job-ready participants in FY17 and FY16.

CHANCE's scope of services expanded to include a greater focus on premanent housing utilizing The Homeless Coalition's Coordinated Entry and Housing First Approach.



Integrated Approach

CHANCE is an integrated education and employment program that includes comprehensive services to help homeless individuals or families sustain employment long-term. Using an innovative job readiness curriculum, CHANCE's instructors focus on retaining participants and advancing them through classes, while individualized case management provides participants with relationship building and resource development.



Participants are referred to CHANCE from Jasper County and attend the CHANCE Empowerment skills for the first two weeks, Monday-Friday, 8AM-4PM with the goal of becoming self-supporting through employment.

CHANCE's participants enroll on average three to six months. CHANCE has 3 phases: Empowerment/Soft Skills, Job Readiness and Career Preparation. Followed by Job Retention and Permanent Housing.
